National Extension Master Gardener Week: Let's shout from the rooftops!

For the first time ever, we will celebrate a *National Extension Master Gardener* week and it is next week, the first week of spring March 20-26. We have national and local graphics and copy for you to use to share over your email and social media platforms.

Best practice for this type of campaign indicates we should post at least twice a day for each day of the week to capture as many audiences as possible. Post twice a day using the graphics and text we created for you.

- In the morning, say around 7:30 or 8 AM post the National EMG suggested text with the national graphic.
- In the afternoon, say around 4:30 or 5, post a WSU graphic along with suggested WSU EMG Program (WA State) suggested text.

The National Extension Master Gardener Committee created the graphics and have asked all states to participate in sharing across platforms. Let's make sure they we show them how it's done. Grab these resources and post across all your social media accounts (personal, Foundation and Program), tell the folks in your counties who manage the social media for your local chapters and programs about the tools and ask them to post.

Program and Foundation Relations:

When Don and I first started, essentially at the same time back in 2018, we saw a need to improve upon the understanding of Program and Foundation partnerships, cognition of articles and incorporation and by-laws, and of policies and procedures. But, I think we both agreed that the bigger need was to work on relationships, to build some trust among foundation chapters and between program and foundation. He and I did some traveling and some Zoom sessions together with other counties to build the relationships and trust. We were both working toward the cohesive statewide program where the whole is greater than the sum of its parts. We've come a long way in these past few years.

Now, I'm getting more and more questions about structure, roles, responsibilities, articles, by-laws, policies, etc. So, I was happy to note that during our BOD retreat, the goal exercise led the MGFWS to adopt goals that addresses these questions. These goals align with program goals to have trained and skilled program coordinators and highly trained and engaged volunteers. I look forward to a time when we have a handbook for onboarding and orienting all board members, to when we have articles, bylaws, policies and procedures and other governing documents that we can use as a model for all counties. To that end, Tana and I have been meeting with a couple of County Foundations and Program Coordinators or Zoom and plan to do at least 5 inperson listening sessions to obtain data about local success and challenges while sharing information about the role and support provided by the WSU Extension Master Gardener Program and the MGFWS.
